2025 is shaping up to be an exciting and busy year with two major projects beginning (and hopefully completing).

Road Resurfacing

It's been close to 20 years since the roads in our community have been repaved. Our roads need fixing. There are many cracks, low spots where water gathers and oil stains. This project will require a lot of patience on the part of all HOA residents. We're looking for volunteers to help with the coordination and communications with residents. It is still to be determined if speed-humps will be installed because the county has changed their laws. We're investigating the installation of stop signs at all intersections to provide greater safety.

Home Maintenance Tips

Now that winter is here, most of us will not be running our air conditioning systems. Winterizing the A/C system will help extend its lifespan, improve efficiency, and prevent costly repairs when the heat returns. Although filters should be changed regularly, now is the perfect time to replace old, dirty filters. It might be appropriate to switch off the A/C, as well. Making sure the outside units are free from debris can be as simple as hosing them off. Regular A/C maintenance, including checking refrigerant levels and flushing condensate drain lines, is essential for the long-term health of your cooling system.

Anyone Say Pests!

Living in Boca Raton, we see our share of pests like ants and iguanas during the summer. Unfortunately, we have our share of winter pests, as well. Ants, silverfish and cockroaches prefer the warmth and resources our homes provide, as opposed to staying outside where the temperatures have dropped. Rodents are also a significant problem in South Florida during the winter. In particular, house mice and roof rats look for nice warm places to make nests and breed this time of year. Although subtle, the temperature changes have arrived, and pests could be seeking shelter. Contact a pest control professional at the first indication of insects and rodents attempting to winter in your home.

Raccoons are generally not a threat to people and are *usually* easily scared off. Raccoons are mostly active during the evening hours; however, it is not uncommon or unusual to see one foraging during the day. Midday is often the quietest time in suburban areas when people are at work and school. Seeing a raccoon out during the day does not indicate that it is dangerous or rabid. Raccoons can also benefit the ecosystem by providing natural, effortless pest control for small reptiles and insects, benefit the growth of wild plant populations by dispersing their seeds through their diet, and aid in the removal of carrion from ecosystems.
